**SUPPLY PROCEDURES FOR THE UNITED STATES ARMY ATTACHE SYSTEM
PROPERTY ACCOUNTABILITY**

1. General. Supply of the United States Army Attache System and other field offices of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Headquarters, Department of the Army, is a responsibility of the Department of the Army, and is under the direction of the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence. These regulations will govern the supply of these offices.

2. Requirements. *a.* Supplies and equipment for the Army Attache System are not included in tables of allowances, tables of organization and equipment, or other Department of the Army directives, and will be requisitioned on an as-required basis.

b. Consolidated forecasts of requirements for standard stock-numbered items supplied by the technical services will be submitted by the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence to the appropriate technical services by 1 April and 1 October each year, with effective date as of the succeeding 1 July and 1 January respectively. Forecasts will cover calendar requirements by half-year periods projected through the current and 2 succeeding fiscal years.

c. Chiefs of technical services will include requirements of the Army Attache System, as furnished by the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, in the Army supply program and in appropriate budget estimates. Material will be issued against these requirements to the extent that it is available from existing stocks within priority or for which funds have been appropriated by Congress. Requisitions will not be canceled for the sole reason that the item was not included in the forecasts.

d. Oversea commanders will consider requirements of United States Army attaches prior to determination of excesses.

e. Army attaches will submit to oversea commanders requirement data as requested by each command. Copies of all lists of requirements submitted to such commanders will be forwarded to the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence.

3. Oversea requisitions. United States Army attaches will submit requisitions as follows:

a. Requisitions will be submitted on DD Form 1348 (DOD Single Line Item Requisition System Document, Manual), prepared in manner prescribed by paragraph 3-9, AR 725-50, to an oversea supply distribution system for supplies and equipment which cannot be procured locally under existing directives.

b. If the required items are not available in the oversea command, requisitions will be submitted on DD Form 1348, prepared in manner prescribed by paragraph 3-9, AR 725-50, to the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence for review and further submission to the Supply Agency, U.S. Army Intelligence Center, Fort Holabird, Baltimore 19, Md.

c. Requisitions for cryptographic equipment from Army attaches will be submitted in accordance with procedures in section IV, AR 380-41.

4. Processing requisitions in CONUS. *a.* The Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence will submit Army attache requisitions to the U.S. Army Intelligence Center, ATTN: Supply Agency. Army attaches will not submit requisitions to CONUS supply sources unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence.

*Effective 1 July 1962, these regulations supersede AR 725-17, 12 June 1959, including C 2, 16 March 1962.

b. The U.S. Army Intelligence Center will submit requisitions for standard items to the appropriate CONUS supply distribution system in the manner prescribed by AR 725-50.

c. Commercial type items will be purchased and packed by the U.S. Army Intelligence Center and shipped by diplomatic pouch or as prescribed by AR 725-50.

5. Accounting. a. The Army attache at each station will maintain informal accountability for all nonexpendable property issued to or on hand at the station, by maintaining an installation property book using DA Form 14-110 (Organization (Installation) Property Record) to account for all nonexpendable property issued to the station. Maintenance of the property book will be in accordance with AR 735-35 except that no entries need be made in the following spaces of the DA Form 14-110: total allowance, current operating allowance, line item number and authority. At his discretion the Army attache may appoint an assistant attache or administrative officer of his station as a property book officer for this purpose. Any such appointment will be made by written orders of the attache station. The appointed individual will have direct responsibility for property of the station as defined in paragraph 7b, AR 735-5 and paragraph 8, AR 735-35 with the Army attache retaining command responsibility as defined in paragraph 7a, AR 735-5 and paragraph 7, AR 735-35.
