Appendix. Major subject or field.	

1. General. Determination of requirements for training of military personnel at civilian educational, commercial, and industrial institutions is based on a careful job analysis of the positions to be filled. The level of training is limited to the extent necessary to qualify the individual to meet anticipated Army requirements in accordance with job descriptions. These regulations describe the report required to determine the input of individuals into specific fields of study and to assist in planning assignments for qualified individuals.

2. Excepted positions. Positions which should be filled by individuals holding degrees in medicine, law, and theology will not be reported under the provisions of these regulations unless these positions also require that the individuals possess graduate training in other fields.

3. Frequency, routing, and due date. An initial complete report will be prepared in triplicate as of 1 June 1963 and will be passed to major commands for approval. Major commands will approve, disapprove, or change and will dispatch the reports to Chief of Personnel Operations, Attn: OPD, Department of the Army, Washington 25, D.C., not later than 15 July 1963. Subsequent reports, in triplicate, need be submitted only as changes in requirements occur. However, each agency will conduct a review of its estab-

lished requirements at least annually as of 1 June in order to insure continued timeliness of previously reported requirements.

4. Report form. The report will be prepared on DA Form 2654-R (Military Personnel Requirements for Graduate Level Education (fig. 1)) which will be locally reproduced on 8- by 10 1/2-inch paper.

5. Preparing agencies. Reports will be compiled and submitted by the Department of the Army staff agencies and major commands listed below. Because of the requirements for Army personnel with graduate level education within the US Army elements of Department of Defense agencies, reports from these agencies are requested in accordance with paragraph 3.

- Chief, Management Office, Office, Secretary of the Army
- Chief, Management Office, Office, Chief of Staff
- Deputy Chiefs of Staff
- Chief, Research and Development
- Comptroller of the Army
- Chief, Office of Reserve Components
- The Inspector General
- Assistant Chiefs of Staff
- Chief of Military History
- Chief of Information
- Chief of Finance

6. Criteria for selection of positions. The following criteria will be used for determining and categorizing positions which require assignment of military personnel who possess graduate level training:

a. Category I. Positions which are required by law or Army policy to be filled by individuals who possess graduate training in a relevant field of study. These positions may be supervisory or non-supervisory. Grade is not significant. Examples are professorships at the U.S. Military Academy.

b. Category II. Positions in which the major, or most significant, duties cannot be performed except by individuals who possess qualifications that can normally be acquired only by completion of graduate training in a relevant field of study. These positions are predominantly nonsupervisory and first-line supervisory in type. There must be a meaningful and consistent relationship between the position, field of training, MOS, and type of organization. Although these positions will tend to be in the lower commissioned officer grades,

positions in other grades are not necessarily excluded for reasons of grade alone. Examples are positions requiring assignment of fully qualified physical, biological, and social scientists; engineers; designers; analysts; teachers; writers; and statisticians.

c. Category III. Positions which must be filled by individuals who are required to exert direct technical supervision, of second line or higher level, over military and/or civilian personnel who are required to possess graduate training. These positions are exclusively supervisory and assistant supervisory in nature. There must be a general relationship between the position and the field of training, MOS, and type of organization. Although these positions will tend to be in the field grades, some may be in the grade of captain. Generally, however, level and type of organization supervised will be of more significance than the position grade. Examples are chiefs of laboratories, detachments, sections, branches, divisions, and similar organizations of a technical, analytical, developmental, or research nature.

d. Category IV. Positions which must be filled by individuals who possess sufficient knowledge of a specific field of study to permit effective staff planning, coordination, and command advisory service. The knowledge, in turn, must be sufficient to provide that comprehension of theory, principles, terminology, processes, and techniques which is necessary for effective appraisal and evaluation of complex programs. Examples of these positions are those of action officer at general staff and special staff levels in the headquarters of Department of the Army and the major commands, major departmental unit chiefs of Headquarters, Department of the Army agencies and members of technical and tactical boards.

e. Category V. Positions in which graduate level training is desirable in order to permit effective planning and coordination and to afford prestige in dealing with other military services, governmental agencies, educational institutions, private concerns, and representatives of foreign governments. Examples are various types of staff and liaison positions.

7. Criteria for grouping positions within categories. The following criteria will be used for grouping within categories positions which re-

quire assignment of personnel who possess graduate-level training:

a. *Group A.* A position which must be occupied by a qualified incumbent or the mission of the organization cannot be accomplished.

b. *Group B.* A position which must be occupied by a qualified incumbent or accomplishment of the mission of the organization will be seriously impaired.

c. *Group C.* A position which must be occupied by a qualified incumbent or the organization, although still able to perform its mission, will be unable to function at an acceptable level of efficiency.

8. Data to be reported. All positions authorized in TOE's or TD's for which any agency listed in paragraph 5 is responsible and requiring assignment of military personnel with master or doctoral degrees, or their equivalent, will be reported, except for those described in paragraph 2. One DA Form 2654-R will be prepared for each position reported. The majority of the positions reported will be in TD organizations, but appropriate positions in TOE organizations will also be reported. Each position reported will be selected on the basis of the criteria in paragraph 6 and only when, in the opinion of the commander, the possession of the indicated training is essential to proper job performance. No position will be reported merely because the current incumbent holds an advanced degree. Conversely, a position for which the requirement exists will be reported even though the current incumbent does not hold a degree.

a. *Item 1—Organization and location.* Enter the identity and location of the unit in which the position is authorized.

b. *Item 2—Position Title, item 3—MOS, item 4—Grade, item 5—Branch.* Enter the exact title of the position, the MOS code, the grade, and the branch symbol listed in the TOE or TD under which the unit is organized.

c. *Items 6 through 9—Data.* Enter the numerical designation of the TOE or TD in which the position is authorized and under which the unit is organized, the date of the TOE or TD, the paragraph number, and the number of the line of the position in the TOE or TD.

d. *Item 10—Level of graduate training required.* Enter a check in the appropriate block to

indicate the particular level of graduate training required.

e. *Item 11—Field of special training required.* Enter the major subject or field in which graduate level training is required by the position being reported. See the appendix for selection of the proper title and code number for the major subject or field. For example an agency reporting a position requirement for an officer trained to a graduate level in mechanical engineering would record in this space: "(415), Engineering Mechanical." If analysis of the position indicates a requirement for an officer with *some* training in a second field, in addition to the major field, both fields should be listed with the primary field preceded by "(a)" and the second field by "(b)". For example, if a position requires an officer with a master's degree in civil engineering with some additional training in physics, the listing should be "(a) (408) Engineering Civil, (b) (729) Physics General." When two fields are reported however, the basis for their determination should be reflected in Section B, Description of Duties. If the requirement is for a field not contained in the appendix, refer to AR 330-330 for the proper code.

f. *Item 12—Identification of law or policy.* (Reference Category I, par. 6a.) Briefly identify pertinent law or policy.

g. *Item 13—New position or deletion of position.* DA Form 2654-R will be used for either new or deleted positions. If used for a position not previously reported, the DA Form 2654-R must be completed. If used to delete a position previously validated, complete items 1 through 13 and the authentication portion of item 15 only.

h. *Section B—Description of duties.* Enter a brief description of each duty which incumbent in the reported position must perform and which requires academic training in the field or subject and to the level indicated in items 10 and 11 of the report form. Indicate also opposite each listed duty, in the column provided, the approximate percentage of normal duty time usually spent in the performance of the listed duty. For example: Duty—"Designs components of transmitter and receiver sub-systems for acquisition radar component of combat surveillance system." Percentage of time—"40%".

i. Section C—Priority, category, and grouping.

- (1) In item 15a enter the total number of positions being submitted by the preparing agency.
- (2) In item 15b enter the ranking of the reported position within the total number submitted by the preparing agency. Since the total reported requirements for graduate level trained officers may exceed the Army's resources and because of the lead time needed for the selection and training of such personnel, it is essential that each preparing agency rank all positions submitted. The general basis for this ranking should be the extent to which the duties that require graduate training are considered vital to the performance of the unit's mission.
- (3) In item 15c enter a check in the appropriate block to indicate the category of the position as determined by the criteria for selection of positions in paragraph 6.
- (4) In item 15d enter a check in the appropriate block to indicate the group within category of the position as determined by the criteria for grouping positions within categories provided in paragraph 7.

j. Item 16. In item 16 "Approving Agency" will enter the subparagraphs *a* through *d* as described in *i* above but may upgrade, downgrade, or confirm the date submitted by the preparing agency. In those instances in which there is no approving agency (i.e., reports prepared by Hq, DA agencies), preparing agencies will complete reports, except for item 16, and forward reports in accordance with paragraph 3.

k. General instructions. Each report (DA Form 2654-R) will indicate in appropriate blocks

the addressee; the preparing and approving agency; the name, grade, title, and signature of authenticating individual. Date of preparation will be placed in the heading of the report.

9. Validation. *a.* Each position reported will be reviewed by a senior officers' board at Headquarters, Department of the Army, on the basis of the validity of the requirement, its relative importance, and the ability to provide or train a qualified individual for it. Those positions which are thereby validated will be assigned an identifying code number and one copy returned to the reporting agency as confirmation to the agency of the validation.

b. Upon receipt thereof, the organizational tables in which the validated position is shown will be annotated to reflect the assigned code number, the field of training, and the level of training.

c. Requisitions, DA Form 872 (Requisition for Officer Personnel), submitted against each such position will be annotated in the "Remarks" column to indicate the civil schooling requirement and the assigned code number. Example: A position is reported under the provisions of these regulations as requiring the assignment of an officer with a master's degree in mechanical engineering. The organizational table in which the position is authorized should then be locally noted "This position requires (415) Engineering Mechanical, as reported on DA Form 2654-R." DA Form 872, when subsequently submitted in accordance with AR 614-185, should contain the same notation. Military personnel may be assigned against these requisitions on the basis of experience considered equivalent to the indicated degrees; however, requirements for military personnel possessing graduate level education will not be considered valid without the above described annotation.
