FOREIGN AREA OFFICER (FAO) PROGRAM

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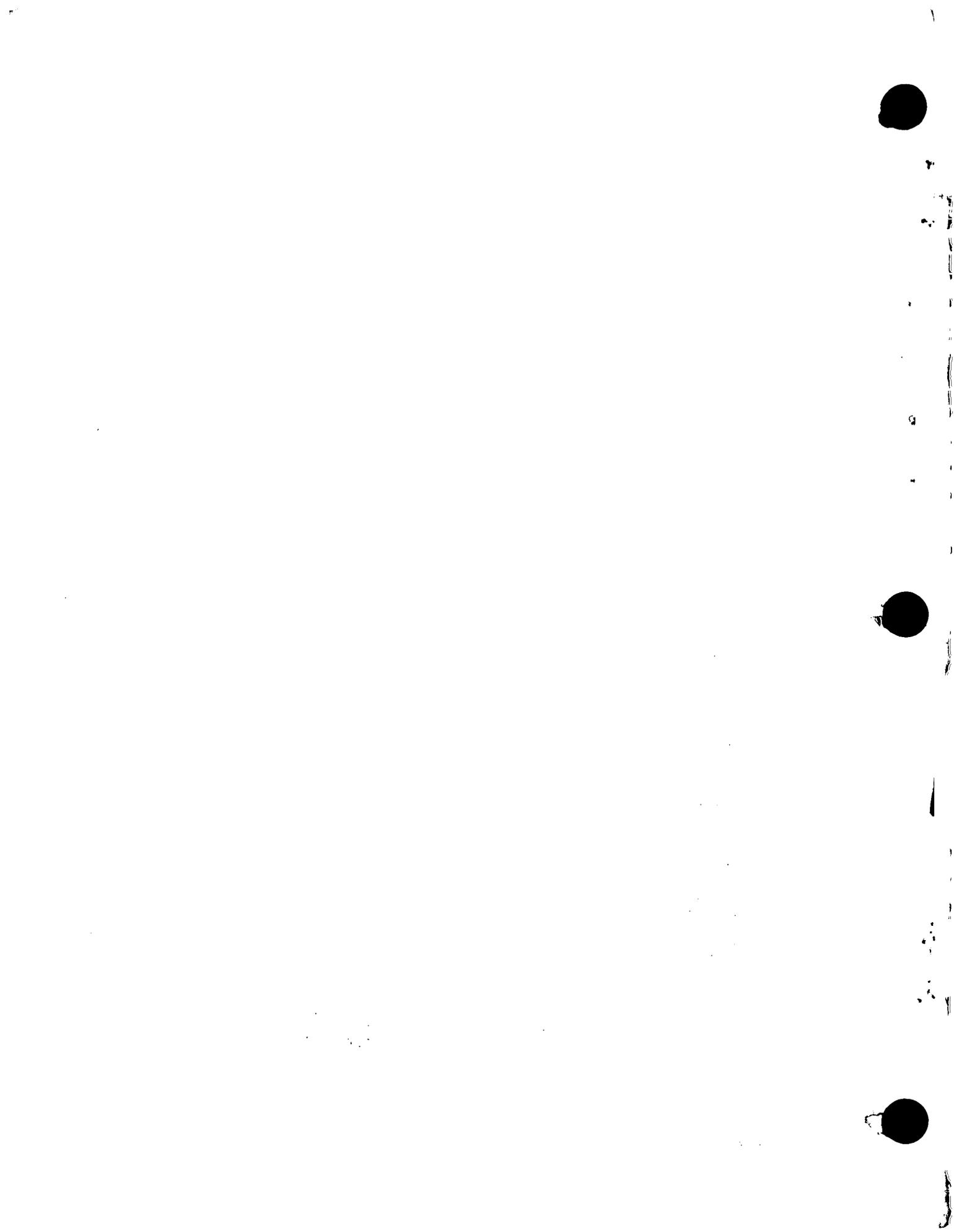

ASSIGNMENTS, DETAILS, AND TRANSFERS
FOREIGN AREA OFFICER (FAO) PROGRAM

Ch 1,

Effective 15 April 1973

This regulation consolidates AR 614-134 and AR 614-142 and establishes the Foreign Area Officer (FAO) Program; it assigns responsibilities and prescribes policy and procedures governing the selection, training, and utilization of program participants. Local supplementation of this regulation is prohibited, except upon approval of HQDA (DAPC-OPD-PD) TEMPO ABC, WASH DC 20315.

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*This regulation supersedes AR 614-134, 30 June 1971 and AR 614-142, 12 January 1972.



CHAPTER 1

GENERAL

1-1. Purpose. This regulation establishes a Foreign Area Officer Program to simplify and standardize provisions relating to procurement, utilization, and career progression of qualified officers. The Foreign Area Officer (FAO) Program consolidates and replaces the Foreign Area Specialty (FAS) and Military Assistance Officer (MAO) Programs.

1-2. Objective. The objective of the FAO Program is to produce qualified officers for assignment to Department of Defense and Department of the Army positions requiring a language proficiency, detailed knowledge of foreign areas, politico-military awareness and other specialized skills relating to the FAO Program.

1-3. Scope. This program provides a personnel management system for individuals possessing critical skills to include foreign area expertise, and serving as commanders, advisors, attachés, and key staff officers in the conduct of military activities having social, economic, political, and psychological impact. This program will permit qualified officers to advance progressively to FAO positions at the highest levels of responsibility.

1-4. Explanation of terms. For the purpose of this regulation the following explanations apply:

a. Foreign Area Officers (FAO's) are officers qualified in their basic branch, skilled in politico-military and security assistance affairs, who possess a detailed knowledge of at least one foreign region, its people, language, and indigenous armed forces.

b. Politico-military activities are the complex of military operations conducted primarily for their direct social, economic, political and psychological impact. These positions include the developmental aspects of stability operations, civil affairs operations, psychological operations, security assistance programing, advising on foreign country information and community relations programs, and other military staff functions having significant socio-political connotations.

c. FAO position is one which has been identified as requiring an officer with skills of an FAO program member. The position must have been validated as requiring a graduate degree under the provisions of AR 621-108.

d. Security assistance refers to assistance responsibilities assigned to the Secretary of Defense under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, and the Foreign Military Sales Act as amended; and successor related legislation; and by Executive Orders and directives.

e. Key Foreign Area Officer positions are those positions which carry the highest degree of responsibility and require incumbents with extensive experience in foreign area politico-military and security assistance affairs. Key FAO positions call for officers in the grade of colonel and a limited number of lieutenant colonels to be filled by program members. Key FAO positions are listed in section I, appendix D.

f. Supporting positions are those positions which require specialized training and do not require incumbent with extensive experience in foreign area, politico-military and security assistance affairs. Supporting FAO positions call for officers in the grade of captain, major, and lieutenant colonel and should also be filled to the extent possible by program members. Supporting positions are developmental in nature and should prepare incumbents to serve in key positions. Supporting positions are listed in section II, appendix D.

1-5. Responsibilities. *a.* The Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel (DCSPER) develops policy and exercises general Staff supervision for the FAO Program.

b. The Commanding General, US Army Military Personnel Center (CGMILPERCEN), operates the program and is responsible for:

(1) Preparing, monitoring, and updating regulatory guidance.

(2) Selecting program members in accordance with established prerequisites listed in paragraph 2-1.

(3) Awarding Additional Skill Identifiers (ASI's) to officers who successfully complete FAO training or who are designated FAO.

(4) Exercising career development and assignment responsibilities for program members.

(5) Maintaining FAO Program positions lists.

c. The Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations (DCSOPS) provides technical advice and assistance to the DCSPER and is responsible for—

(1) Establishing and chairing an FAO Program Consultant Board consisting of members of Office of Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence (OACSI), Office of Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel (ODCSPER), Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics (ODCSLOG), Training and Doctrine Command (TRADOC), and US Army John F. Kennedy Center for Military Assistance (USA JFKCENMA).

(2) Assisting in the formulation of FAO Program policies.

(3) Assisting in the determination of standards for selection of FAO Program members.

(4) Designating FAO Program positions in coordination with CGMILPERCEN and concerned commands and agencies.

(5) Providing guidance as to appropriate training, education, and developmental plans for FAO Program members including curriculum guidance for graduate students.

(6) Coordinating program information support with the Office for the Chief for Information.

(7) Monitoring assignments to FAO Program identified key positions, other than intelligence.

d. The Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence (ACSI)—

(1) Provides advice and assistance to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations.

(2) Monitors assignments of FAO Program members to identified key intelligence positions.

(3) Assists the DCSOPS in formulation of policy for oversea training and manages and budgets for oversea training of FAO Program members.

★e. The Commander, US Army Intelligence Command, through the Director, US Army Personnel Security Group, approves all entrants in the program from a security viewpoint.

f. Officials who submit officer personnel requisitions directly to HQDA are responsible for—

(1) Requesting validation of FAO Program positions in accordance with AR 621-108.

(2) Correctly annotating personnel requisitions with ASI and other information as required.

CHAPTER 2

ELIGIBILITY, SELECTION, AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT

2-1. Prerequisites. Officers on active duty who meet the following criteria are eligible to participate:

a. Assigned to a branch other than Chaplains, Army Medical Department, or Judge Advocate General's Corps.

b. Serving in the grade of captain through colonel.

c. Have a minimum of three years' basic branch duty to include duty with troops. (Troop duty for officers of the technical and administrative services may include either detail with combat arms or duty with troop units of the appropriate technical or administrative service.)

d. Possess the following educational background which may be waived by the CG MIL PERCEN in clearly justifiable cases:

(1) Military schooling appropriate to grade and length of service. (Captains who have completed or are in attendance at an appropriate Branch Advanced Course may apply for the program.)

(2) Possess a baccalaureate degree preferably in a social/political science or related discipline from an accredited college or university including the military academies (app B); and have demonstrated an academic proficiency suitable for graduate study at an accredited university.

e. Have demonstrated a high level of intelligence, initiative, imagination, judgment, and the potential for advancement to positions of great responsibility.

f. For lieutenant colonels and colonels, have previously been assigned to politico-military or security assistance duties (this can be waived in justifiable cases).

g. Have attained a minimum score of 22 on the Defense Language Aptitude Test for foreign language training, or have a foreign language proficiency at the S3/R3 level. (This requirement may be waived in clearly justifiable cases.)

★*h.* Be a US citizen and eligible for TOP SECRET clearance in accordance with the provisions of AR 604-5.

i. Be free of marital difficulty and from abnormal family ties or business complications which

might divert attention from military duty. Foreign financial interests, foreign investments and continual excessive personal indebtedness are possible causes for disqualification.

j. Indicate a desire to participate in the program.

k. Have been accepted for retention on active duty under the provisions of AR 135-215 (for Reserve component officers only).

l. Agree to complete the prescribed training, and upon completion thereof have at least four years active duty service remaining. Students incur the service obligation upon entry into any single phase of the training program in accordance with AR 621-1.

m. Be uncommitted to another Army Officer Special Career Program.

2-2. Application procedures. *a. When to apply.* Officers are encouraged to apply prior to completion of 12 years of Federal active commissioned service and before reaching age 37.

b. Who may apply. Officers serving on active duty who meet the prescribed criteria may apply for this program. Applications should cite this regulation as the governing directive.

c. How to apply. Officers will forward completed applications to their military superior who will indorse and forward direct to HQDA (DAPC-OPD- _____)

(Colonels division or appropriate career branch)

TEMPO ABC, WASH, DC 20315. The indorser will include availability information and the raw score obtained by the applicant on the Defense Language Aptitude Test (DLAT).

d. Contents of the application. Applications will include the following:

(1) A brief statement indicating a desire for membership in the FAO Program.

(2) Additional special qualification not included in official files.

(3) A listing of areas desired in order of preference (app A). The applicant will indicate either that no other areas are acceptable, or that any other area for which he may be selected is acceptable.

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(4) A listing of all languages studied, including institutions or places of study, inclusive dates, and degree of fluency in listening and reading comprehension now retained. If the applicant has been tested within the past year, scores will be included. If the applicant has not been so tested and language tests are available, he will accomplish them prior to submitting his application.

(5) A statement as follows:

If I am selected for the Foreign Area Officer Program, I intend to complete the prescribed training and upon completion will remain on active duty for a period of not less than four years. I renounce any intention to resign, retire, or otherwise be relieved from active duty prior to four years subsequent to the completion of such training, unless I am relieved sooner from the program or from active duty for the convenience of the Government. I understand that, if I successfully complete the prescribed training, I will be subject to alternating branch and specialty assignments, which may include attaché assignments, throughout the remainder of my Army career.

(6) Inclosures as follows:

(a) *Inclosure 1.* DD Form 398 (Statement of Personal History) completed in five copies. Item 15 will list all resident addresses, including government quarters on military reservations. Military unit designation should not be shown in column headed "Street and Number." Item 20 also will include the statement "I have executed DD Form 93 satisfactorily." DD Form 398 must be submitted even though previously submitted for some other purposes. Credit and character references must be other than those listed on a previous DD Form 398. Use account numbers on all credit card references. Incomplete forms will precipitate a delay in application processing. An applicant who applies while unmarried and, subsequently marries, will immediately forward a correction to his DD Form 398 and inclosures as listed in (d) and (e) below.

(b) *Inclosure 2.* DD Form 1584 (National Agency Check Request) completed in five copies.

(c) *Inclosure 3.* Accomplished FBI Fingerprint Card in duplicate (FD-258).

(d) *Inclosure 4.* A recent photograph of portrait type (about 2½ x 2½ inches) of the applicant and his spouse, if married. (These must be stapled separately on white bond paper (8 x 10 inches).)

(e) *Inclosure 5.* One copy of DA Form 3083-R (Medical Examination for Certain Geographical Areas) (para 10-29b(3), AR 40-501) accomplished for applicant and dependents.

(f) *Inclosure 6.* Official transcripts of all college or university credits earned by the applicant to the date of application.

(g) *Inclosure 7.* Graduate Record Examination Aptitude Test scores as reported by the Educational Testing Service, Princeton, NJ. Information pertaining to this test may be obtained from the Educational Testing Service, Box 955, Princeton, NJ 08540. Applicants who have attained a masters degree in Foreign Area Studies or related disciplines (app B) are not required to take this test.

2-3. Entry into program. a. The CGMILPER-CEN will select officers on a best-qualified basis to participate in the program.

b. HQDA will advise applicants of selection or nonselection as soon as final action on the application is completed. HQDA will award and Unit Personnel Officers will enter Additional Skill Identifier (ASI) Code and "Foreign Area Officer (area) Trainee" in items 9 and 15 respectively, DA Form 66 (Officer Qualification Record), in accordance with AR 640-2, for those officers selected for program participation. See appendix A for listing of ASI's and areas. For those who have no specific area expertise, ASI 4Z will be awarded.

c. HQDA will award a Prefix F to program participants upon completion of training in accordance with AR 640-2. The "Trainee" annotation then will be removed from DA Form 66.

d. In order to minimize any possibility of misunderstanding or injustice to applicants who are not selected for program membership, notice of nonselection will not be made part of an officer's official military personnel file, either in the field or at HQDA. It is the responsibility

of the individual, upon notice of nonselection, to have the copy of his application removed from his military personnel records jacket.

2-4. Career development. a. Development of each officer will be accomplished through schooling, increasingly important branch material command, staff, and FAO assignments consistent with the needs of the service, background, and expressed interest of the officer.

b. Officers who are accepted for entry into the FAO Program and in the grades of lieutenant colonel and colonel will be trained as necessary to meet projected assignments and FAO Program requirements except for graduate schooling which must be accomplished prior to completion of 19 years Army promotion service for RA officers and 15 years active Federal service for Reserve component officers.

c. *In accordance with established requirements and personnel selection procedures,* new FAO Program members in the grade of captain or major will receive Foreign Area Officer Command and Staff Course (FAO-C&SC), 12 months of graduate training that is regionally oriented, language training appropriate to the region of interest, and in-country training for that region. Career branches, in coordination with commands and agencies concerned, will determine availability for commencement of training.

d. Majors and lieutenant colonels presently in the MAO Program will be afforded the opportunity to complete all phases of FAO training if it can be accomplished prior to completion of 19 years promotion service for RA officers and 15 years active Federal service for Reserve component officers. This includes graduate schooling, FAO C&SC, language training, in-country training, and for attaché candidates the Defense Intelligence School. In-country training may be waived in individual cases where constructive credit is allowed for previous and projected oversea duty which satisfies the FAO training requirement.

e. Colonels presently in the MAO Program will be trained as necessary to meet projected assignments and FAO Program requirements.

f. Officers presently in the FAS Program will receive the FAO C&SC.

g. The perspective of every FAO will be broadened as follows: former MAOP members will be considered for attaché assignments while former FASP members will serve in FAO security assistance positions. Special functional training and development in such fields as civil affairs, psychological operations, and intelligence will be based on requirements and personal desires. Specific courses at the US Army Institute for Military Assistance, Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and the Defense Intelligence School, Washington, DC (for those selected for attaché duty) will be given to train officers in the above functional field in addition to the FAO Program core curriculum. Official designation as a Foreign Area Officer will be made after completion of all phases of training.

h. FAO training will consist of the following:

(1) *Academic.*

(a) *Civil.* This advanced degree training (12 months) in area studies or in another appropriate FAO Program discipline is provided at selected universities in the United States or overseas. The program of instruction includes subjects pertaining to the geography, history, economics, politics, and sociology of the country or area of study and appropriate subjects required by the school's graduate degree program. This phase of training may be omitted for personnel possessing an appropriate graduate degree from the academic discipline list in appendix B. Officers who have acquired a graduate degree at government expense, under the cooperative degree or the degree completion program (Boot Strap) will not be permitted to pursue another degree. The areas in which training is offered and the content and sequence of instruction may be revised, as necessary, to meet the current requirements, university training loads, and budgetary limitations. (See appendix C for Curriculum Guidance.)

(b) *Military.* This training consists of attendance at the six months' Foreign Area Officer Command and Staff Course at the Institute for Military Assistance, Fort Bragg, North Carolina, and attendance at other selected mili-

tary schools needed to meet specific requirements.

(2) *Language.* This phase of training consists of six to twelve months of language instruction normally conducted at the Defense Language Institute (DLI). Training is conducted at civilian institutions in languages not taught at DLI. This phase of training may be omitted for personnel currently proficient (S3/R3) in the appropriate language, verified by current Defense Language Proficiency Test (DLPT) scores.

(3) *Overseas.* In-country training consists of travel, research, and study in the oversea area of specialization; 30 months for the Arab World (Master's degree and in-country); 24 months for Russia in a controlled environmental community in West Germany; 24 months for China of which 12 months consists of training at the American Embassy School of Chinese Language and Area Studies at Taichung, Taiwan. All other areas are normally 12 months duration except in those cases where an FAS member attends a host country Command and General Staff College level or higher school which is 6 months' duration or longer. In this case, in-country training will be extended to 18 months. During this phase of training, an FAO works directly under supervision of a military officer and receives an efficiency report in lieu of an academic report. In-country training may be delayed if in-country personnel restrictions preclude the assignment of additional FAO's. In-country training may be waived if an individual has served a tour of duty in his area of concentration for a minimum of 12 months which satisfies the FAO training requirement.

i. Upon completion of FAO training, officers will be utilized in selected positions preferably in the country/region of specialization. Members who meet the prerequisites of AR 611-60 will be given priority consideration for assignment to the Defense Attaché System. Subsequent development of each officer will be accomplished through increasingly important branch material command and staff and FAO assignments.

j. Following an initial utilization assignment,

FAO utilization tours will alternate with basic branch qualifying assignments within the framework of branch career patterns. In assignment actions, consideration will be given to overall requirements of the Army, career development of the officer, and the individual's preference.

k. Commanders will, consistent with accomplishment of their mission, insure that FAO's are utilized in consonance with the career development policies outlined in this paragraph, both in initial and subsequent assignments within the command. Figure 2-1 illustrates the FAO Program career pattern.

l. Officers participating in the program will receive equal consideration with their contemporaries for appropriate command assignments and for attendance at service schools and colleges.

m. The CG MILPERCEN will schedule FAO's for attendance at appropriate courses at Army schools and training activities and other appropriate single-service or joint courses when attendance is necessary from a position requirement or career development standpoint.

n. Colonels, and lieutenant colonels in a zone of consideration for promotion to colonel, may serve in consecutive FAO assignments in accordance with their expressed preference and subject to availability of an appropriate position at the time of reassignment. Program members being considered for the first time for promotion to colonel should indicate their preference to serve in consecutive FAO Program assignments, by letter, to respective career branches when the zone of consideration has been announced.

2-5. Designation as FAO. *a. Prerequisites.* Officers in active military service who meet the following criteria are eligible to participate in the program as designees.

(1) Assigned to a branch other than Chaplains, Army Medical Department, or Judge Advocate General's Corps.

(2) Serving in the grade of captain through colonel.

(3) Possess the following educational background.

(a) Military schooling appropriate to grade and length of service.

(b) An advanced degree in Area Studies or related discipline.

(c) Proficiency (S3/R3) in the language of the country or area in which specialization is desired.

(4) Have served a minimum of 12 months in an appropriate assignment with the country or area of specialization.

(5) Possess an exceptional record of military service.

(6) Be uncommitted to another Army Officer Special Career Program.

★(7) Meet eligibility requirements contained in paragraphs 2-1 *h* and *i* of this regulation.

b. Applications.

(1) Officers who meet the criteria listed in *a* above may apply for participation in the program. The applicant's immediate military superior will indorse the application and forward it direct to HQDA (DAIPC-OPD-

(Colonels Division or appropriate career branch)

TEMPO ABC, WASH, DC 20315.

(2) Each application will include a statement indicating a desire to be designated an FAO. As a minimum, the following documents must be attached as inclosures to the application:

(a) Official transcripts of all master's level university credits earned by the applicant.

(b) Current scores obtained on the DLPT.

(c) Evidence of having served in an appropriate assignment in area of specialization if not clearly defined in official military records at HQDA.

(d) Inclosures as listed in paragraph 2-2*d*

(6) (a) through (e).

c. Action by CGMILPERCEN. CGMILPERCEN will, on an individual case basis, determine if the applicant's qualifications warrant acceptance and will determine what additional training, CONUS or in-country, may be required.

2-6. Release from program. *a.* Officers may be released from the program for any of the following reasons:

(1) Changes in the projected program requirements as to the number of officers required.

(2) Failure to demonstrate the desired progress in development, duty performance, interest, or aptitude.

(3) Other reasons which indicate that further participation in the program is not warranted.

b. Notification of release from the program will be by Department of the Army letter. Unit personnel officers will delete the ASI Code from item 9 and "Foreign Area Officer" from item 15, DA Form 66 (Officer Qualification Record) in accordance with AR 640-2.

CHAPTER 3

FOREIGN AREA OFFICER PROGRAM POSITION ADMINISTRATION

3-1. Designation of positions. Designation of FAO positions is accomplished concurrently with validation for a graduate degree. FAO positions should be submitted for validation in accordance with AR 621-108.

3-2. Reporting of positions and incumbents. Commands and agencies will report position and incumbent data to the CGMILPERCEN under the provisions of AR 621-108.

3-3. Requisitions. *a.* Requisitions for program members will be submitted in accordance with AR 614-102 or AR 614-185, as appropriate. HQDA will select officers for assignment to FAO validated positions. If there is no program member available in the time frame requested, the requisition will be filled by assignment of the best qualified officer available.

b. Manually prepared requisitions submitted to HQDA for officers to fill FAO positions will include one of the following statements and such other information as may be considered appropriate by the requisitioning agency:

(1) For positions in the grade of colonel, add in column E of the OPO 37 Report, the appropriate ASI and FAO validation number. (See app B for listing of FAO ASI's.)

(2) For positions below the grade of colonel, include the following:

Request assignment of a Foreign Officer. This is an FAO position ASI _____ validation number _____. Incumbent is Lieutenant Colonel John E. Smith, 000-00-0000, IN. Estimated reassignment date _____.

c. The requisitioning of FAO Program members under the Automated Document Writing System or Computer Assisted Officer Assignment Procedure will be as prescribed by applicable instructions issued by CGMILPERCEN. Requisitions will include the appropriate ASI and identifying code characters assigned to the positions (para 3-3, AR 621-108).

3-4. Selection and assignment of officers to fill positions. HQDA normally initiates preliminary action to select qualified officers for assignment to approved positions approximately 6 to 9 months prior to the estimated date of reassignment of officers currently filling positions. Timely information from commanders as to local plans for filling positions will assist in this selection process. Final assignment action will not be accomplished until the receipt of appropriate officer personnel requisitions prepared in accordance with AR 614-102 and AR 614-185.

APPENDIX C
FOREIGN AREA OFFICER (FAO) PROGRAM
CURRICULUM GUIDANCE

1. The objective of the FAO Program is:

a. To produce qualified officers for assignment to Department of Defense and Department of the Army positions requiring a language proficiency, detailed knowledge of foreign areas, politico-military awareness, and other specialized skills related to the FAO Program.

b. To assign them to positions which require this knowledge in fields such as plans and operations, attaché duty, service school instructor, special warfare, intelligence, security assistance, and politico-military affairs.

2. The three training phases of the FAO Program are designed to provide to the individual program member as broad an education concerning an area and its people as is practicable. However, the curriculum which FAO students follow during university training is not subject to direct Army control. This is true because each student must meet the specific graduation requirements of the university which he is attending. On the other hand, the Army does exert influence over the curriculum in two ways, i.e., by enrolling officers in universities offering degrees in interdisciplinary area studies whenever possible, and by advising the students of the types of courses they should select when they have a choice.

3. The university which an FAO will attend is selected because it offers, within current budgetary limitations, the best available course of study for the area in which one is specializing and will permit one to complete degree requirements within 12 months. Ideally, an FAO should study as many of the following subjects pertaining to the area of specialization as one can:

It is recognized that the time available and the graduation requirements of the university certainly will be limiting factors. However, an FAO Program member's goal must be to obtain a comprehensive knowledge of the area's total culture, and one should plan the course of study accordingly.

CHAPTER 1

GENERAL

1-1. Purpose. This regulation establishes a Foreign Area Officer Program to simplify and standardize provisions relating to procurement, utilization, and career progression of qualified officers. The Foreign Area Officer (FAO) Program consolidates and replaces the Foreign Area Specialty (FAS) and Military Assistance Officer (MAO) Programs.

1-2. Objective. The objective of the FAO Program is to produce qualified officers for assignment to Department of Defense and Department of the Army positions requiring a language proficiency, detailed knowledge of foreign areas, politico-military awareness and other specialized skills relating to the FAO Program.

1-3. Scope. This program provides a personnel management system for individuals possessing critical skills to include foreign area expertise, and serving as commanders, advisors, attachés, and key staff officers in the conduct of military activities having social, economic, political, and psychological impact. This program will permit qualified officers to advance progressively to FAO positions at the highest levels of responsibility.

1-4. Explanation of terms. For the purpose of this regulation the following explanations apply:

a. Foreign Area Officers (FAO's) are officers qualified in their basic branch, skilled in politico-military and security assistance affairs, who possess a detailed knowledge of at least one foreign region, its people, language, and indigenous armed forces.

b. Politico-military activities are the complex of military operations conducted primarily for their direct social, economic, political and psy-

chological impact. These positions include the developmental aspects of stability operations, civil affairs operations, psychological operations, security assistance programing, advising on foreign country information and community relations programs, and other military staff functions having significant socio-political connotations.

c. FAO position is one which has been identified as requiring an officer with skills of an FAO program member. The position must have been validated as requiring a graduate degree under the provisions of AR 621-108.

d. Security assistance refers to assistance responsibilities assigned to the Secretary of Defense under the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961, and the Foreign Military Sales Act as amended; and successor related legislation; and by Executive Orders and directives.

e. Key Foreign Area Officer positions are those positions which carry the highest degree of responsibility and require incumbents with extensive experience in foreign area politico-military and security assistance affairs. Key FAO positions call for officers in the grade of colonel and a limited number of lieutenant colonels to be filled by program members. Key FAO positions are listed in section I, appendix D.

f. Supporting positions are those positions which require specialized training and do not require incumbent with extensive experience in foreign area, politico-military and security assistance affairs. Supporting FAO positions call for officers in the grade of captain, major, and lieutenant colonel and should also be filled to the extent possible by program members. Supporting positions are developmental in nature and should prepare incumbents to serve

in key positions. Supporting positions are listed in section II, appendix D.

1-5. Responsibilities. *a.* The Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel (DCSPER) develops policy and exercises general Staff supervision for the FAO Program.

b. The Commanding General, US Army Military Personnel Center (CGMILPERCEN), operates the program and is responsible for:

(1) Preparing, monitoring, and updating regulatory guidance.

(2) Selecting program members in accordance with established prerequisites listed in paragraph 2-1.

(3) Awarding Additional Skill Identifiers (ASI's) to officers who successfully complete FAO training or who are designated FAO.

(4) Exercising career development and assignment responsibilities for program members.

(5) Maintaining FAO Program positions lists.

c. The Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations (DCSOPS) provides technical advice and assistance to the DCSPER and is responsible for:

(1) Establishing and chairing an FAO Program Consultant Board consisting of members of Office of Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence (OACSI), Office of Deputy Chief of Staff for Personnel (ODCSPER), Deputy Chief of Staff for Logistics (ODCSLOG), Training & Doctrine Command (TRADOC), and US Army John F. Kennedy Center for Military Assistance (USAJFKCENMA).

(2) Assisting in the formulation of FAO Program policies.

(3) Assisting in the determination of

standards for selection of FAO Program members.

(4) Designating FAO Program positions in coordination with CGMILPERCEN and concerned commands and agencies.

(5) Providing guidance as to appropriate training, education, and developmental plans for FAO Program members including curriculum guidance for graduate students.

(6) Coordinating program information support with the Office of the Chief for Information.

(7) Monitoring assignments to FAO Program identified key positions, other than intelligence.

d. The Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence (ACSI)—

(1) Provides advice and assistance to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Military Operations.

(2) Monitors assignments of FAO Program members to identified key intelligence positions.

(3) Assists the DCSOPS in formulation of policy for oversea training and manages and budgets for oversea training of FAO Program members.

e. The Commanding Officer, US Army Intelligence Command (CO USAIC), through the Director, US Army Personnel Security Group, approves all entrants in the program from a security viewpoint.

f. Officials who submit officer personnel requisitions directly to HQDA are responsible for:

(1) Requesting validation of FAO Program positions in accordance with AR 621-108.

(2) Correctly annotating personnel requisitions with ASI and other information as required.

CHAPTER 2

ELIGIBILITY, SELECTION, AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT

2-1. Prerequisites. Officers on active duty who meet the following criteria are eligible to participate:

a. Assigned to a branch other than Chaplains, Army Medical Department, or Judge Advocate General's Corps.

b. Serving in the grade of captain through colonel.

c. Have a minimum of three years' basic branch duty to include duty with troops. (Troop duty for officers of the technical and administrative services may include either detail with combat arms or duty with troop units of the appropriate technical or administrative service.)

d. Possess the following educational background which may be waived by the CGMILPERCEN in clearly justifiable cases:

(1) Military schooling appropriate to grade and length of service. (Captains who have completed or are in attendance at an appropriate Branch Advanced Course may apply for the program.)

(2) Possess a baccalaureate degree preferably in a social/political science or related discipline from an accredited college or university to include the military academies (app B); and demonstrated an academic proficiency suitable for graduate study at an accredited university.

e. Demonstrated a high level of intelligence, initiative, imagination, judgment, and the potential for advancement to positions of great responsibility.

f. For lieutenant colonels and colonels, have previously been assigned to politico-military or security assistance duties (this can be waived in justifiable cases).

g. Attained a minimum score of 22 on the Defense Language Aptitude Test for foreign language training, or have a foreign language proficiency at the S3/R3 level. (This requirement may be waived in clearly justifiable cases.)

h. Be a US citizen by birth. (This prerequisite may be waived on an individual basis by the CO USAIC.) Members of an applicant's immediate family including spouse, if married, parents, foster parents, step parents, brothers, sisters, and children must be US citizens though not necessarily by birth. Foreign born family members must have been US citizens for at least five years. Applicant and spouse, if married, should have no near relatives or persons to whom they may be bound by ties of affection, kinship, or obligation residing in a country within whose boundaries physical or mental coercion is known to be a common practice, either against persons accused of acting in the interests of the United States or against relatives of such persons. Further, applicant and spouse will have neither commercial nor vested interests in such a country. For purposes of this regulation, near relatives will include father, mother, brother, sister, daughter, son, uncle, aunt, grandparent, father-in-law, mother-in-law, step-relations corresponding to any of the above, and persons acting in loco parentis.

i. Be free of marital difficulty and from abnormal family ties or business complications which might divert attention from military duty. Foreign financial interests, foreign investments and continual excessive personal indebtedness are possible causes for disqualification.

j. Have no information on file (personnel or

medical) which, in the opinion of the CO USAIC would prevent the granting of a security clearance. Officers who are not presently members of the FAS Program will be required to undergo a background investigation. Applicants must be clearable for at least TOP SECRET.

k. Indicate a desire to participate in the program.

l. Accepted for retention on active duty under the provisions of AR 135-215 (for Reserve component officers only).

m. Agree to complete the prescribed training, and upon completion thereof have at least four years active duty service remaining. Students incur the service obligation upon entry into any single phase of the training program in accordance with AR 621-1.

n. Uncommitted to another Army Officer Special Career Program.

2-2. Application procedures. a. *When to apply.* Officers are encouraged to apply prior to completion of 12 years of Federal active commissioned service and before reaching age 37.

b. *Who may apply.* Officers serving on active duty who meet the prescribed criteria may apply for this program. Applications should cite this regulation as the governing directive.

c. *How to apply.* Officers will forward completed applications to their military superior who will indorse and forward direct to HQDA (DAPC-OPD- _____)

(Colonels division or appropriate
career branch)

TEMPO ABC, WASH, DC 20315. The indorser will include availability information and the raw score obtained by the applicant on the Defense Language Aptitude Test (DLAT).

d. *Contents of the application.* Applications will include the following:

(1) A brief statement indicating a desire for membership in the FAO Program.

(2) Additional special qualification not included in official files.

(3) A listing of areas desired in order of preference (app A). The applicant will indicate

either that no other areas are acceptable, or that any other area for which he may be selected is acceptable.

(4) A listing of all languages studied, to include institutions or places of study, inclusive dates, and degree of fluency in listening and reading comprehension now retained. If the applicant has been tested within the past year, scores will be included. If the applicant has not been so tested and language tests are available, he will accomplish them prior to submitting his application.

(5) A statement as follows:

If I am selected for the Foreign Area Officer Program, I intend to complete the prescribed training and upon completion will remain on active duty for a period of not less than four years. I renounce any intention to resign, retire, or otherwise be relieved from active duty prior to four years subsequent to the completion of such training, unless I am relieved sooner from the program or from active duty for the convenience of the Government. I understand that, if I successfully complete the prescribed training, I will be subject to alternating branch and specialty assignments, which may include attaché assignments, throughout the remainder of my Army career.

(6) Inclosures as follows:

(a) *Inclosure 1.* DD Form 398 (Statement of Personal History) completed in five copies. Item 15 will list all resident addresses, including government quarters on military reservations. Military unit designation should not be shown in column headed "Street and Number." Item 20 also will include the statement "I have executed DD Form 93 satisfactorily." DD Form 398 must be submitted even though previously submitted for some other purpose. Credit and character references must be other than those listed on a previous DD Form 398. Use account numbers on all credit card references. Incomplete forms will precipitate a delay in application processing. An applicant who applies while unmarried and, subsequently marries, will immediately forward a correction to his DD Form 398 and inclosures as listed in (d) and (e) below.

(b) *Inclosure 2.* DD Form 1584 (National Agency Check Request) completed in five copies.

(c) *Inclosure 3.* Accomplished FBI Fingerprint Card in duplicate (FD-258).

FAO utilization tours will alternate with basic branch qualifying assignments within the framework of branch career patterns. In assignment actions, consideration will be given to overall requirements of the Army, career development of the officer, and the individual's preference.

k. Commanders will, consistent with accomplishment of their mission, insure that FAO's are utilized in consonance with the career development policies outlined in this paragraph, both in initial and subsequent assignments within the command. Figure 2-1 illustrates the FAO Program career pattern.

l. Officers participating in the program will receive equal consideration with their contemporaries for appropriate command assignments and for attendance at service schools and colleges.

m. The CGMILPERCEN will schedule FAO's for attendance at appropriate courses at Army schools and training activities and other appropriate single-service or joint courses when attendance is necessary from a position requirement or career development standpoint.

n. Colonels, and lieutenant colonels in a zone of consideration for promotion to colonel, may serve in consecutive FAO assignments in accordance with their expressed preference and subject to availability of an appropriate position at the time of reassignment. Program members being considered for the first time for promotion to colonel should indicate their preference to serve in consecutive FAO Program assignments, by letter, to respective career branches when the zone of consideration has been announced.

2-5. Designation as FAO. *a. Prerequisites.* Officers in active military service who meet the following criteria are eligible to participate in the program as designees.

(1) Assigned to a branch other than Chaplains, Army Medical Department, or Judge Advocate General's Corps.

(2) Serving in the grade of captain through colonel.

(3) Possess the following educational background.

(a) Military schooling appropriate to grade and length of service.

(b) An advanced degree in Area Studies or related discipline.

(c) Proficiency (S3/R3) in the language of the country or area in which specialization is desired.

(4) Served a minimum of 12 months in an appropriate assignment with the country or area of specialization.

(5) Possess an exceptional record of military service.

(6) Uncommitted to another Army Officer Special Career Program.

(7) Applicant and members of immediate family must be US citizens by birth (may be waived by CO USAIC).

(8) Have sound family relationship and be free of foreign financial interests.

(9) Be able to meet requirements for an appropriate security clearance.

b. Applications.

(1) Officers who meet the criteria listed in *a* above may apply for participation in the program. The applicant's immediate military superior will indorse the application and forward it direct to HQDA (DAPC-OPD-

(2) Each application will include a statement indicating a desire to be designated a FAO. As a minimum, the following documents must be attached as inclosures to the application:

(a) Official transcripts of all master level university credits earned by the applicant.

(b) Current scores obtained on the DLPT.

(c) Evidence of having served in an appropriate assignment in area of specialization if not clearly defined in official military records at HQDA.

(d) Inclosures as listed in paragraph 2-2d(6)(a) through (e).
