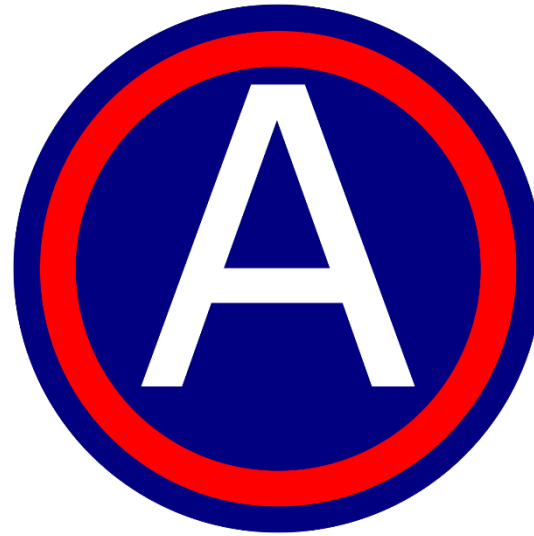

- ARCENT Training meetings.
 - Synchronizes training efforts over 18-24 months.
 - Utilizes the US Army 8-Step Training Model.
 - Unit focused: Heavy and Light Unit per Partner.

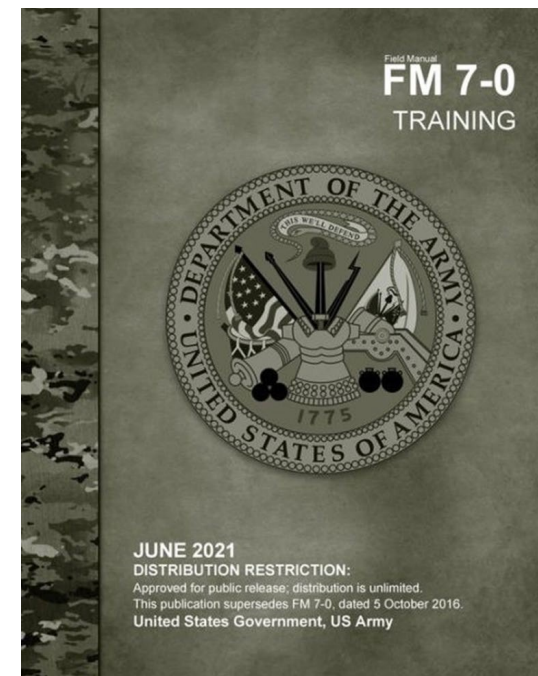
- Training Triad.
 - **TF Spartan:** Individual, Platoon, and Company collective training.
 - **3SFAB:** Unit Collective Training, BN/BDE MDMP, CTC Partner.
 - **SPP:** Individual and Specialty training.

- Combat Training Center Program.
 - **Phase-1:** Generate interest in regional partners to attend JRTC and NTC at company level. 3SFAB integrates the Army 8-Step Training Model and the CTC Road to War – enhancing unit proficiency and demonstrating the effectiveness of the Army 8-Step Training Model.
 - **Phase-2:** Collaborate with regional partners on developing rigor within their Combat Training Center platforms: Operations Groups, Exercise Planners, After Action Reviews, OPFOR, and Equipment/Terrain.

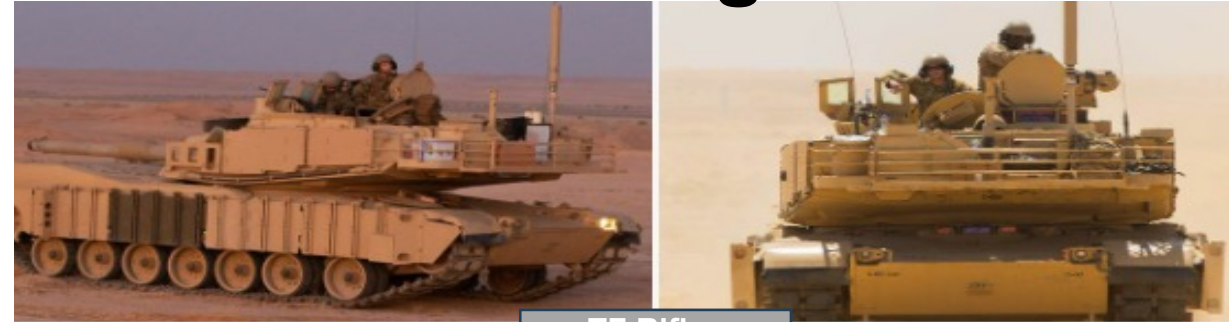




Building Readiness

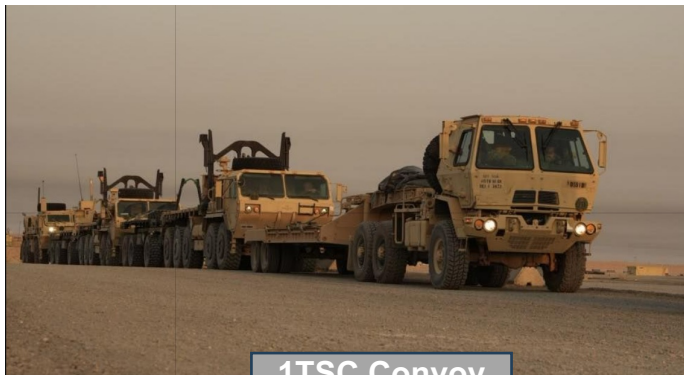

Western Access Network

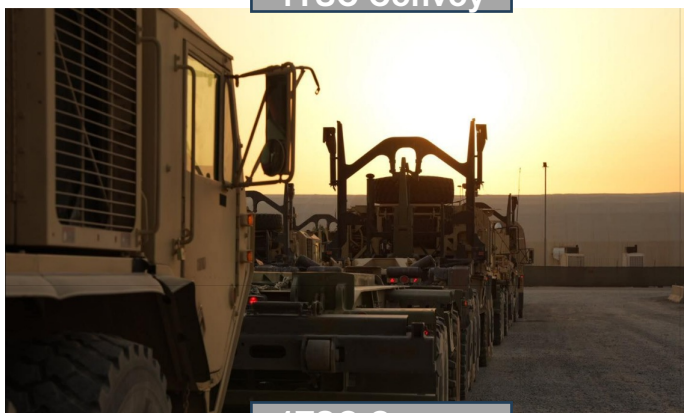
- Western Access Network enables Joint Force access across the Arabian Peninsula during times of crisis.

- Border Agreements.



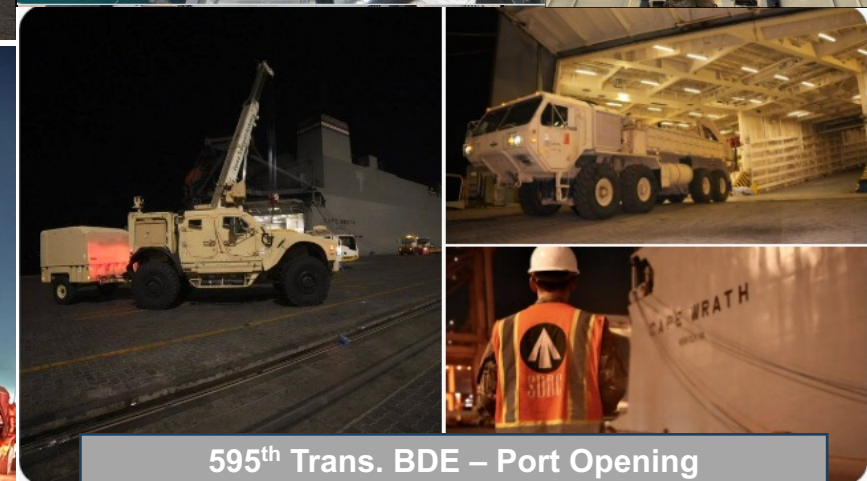
